The program does not assume that participants are alcoholics or addicts.

A wide variety of people have driven while affected by alcohol or drugs, under a variety of circumstances.

The RDP is intended to help each person look at what caused this for them, and how they can avoid it happening again.

Steps to Completion

Step 1: Register for the Responsible Driver Program (RDP)

Step 2: Actively participate in the RDP sessions

Step 3: Complete the RDP course requirements



Length of the RDP

The entire program can take nine months or longer to complete. You should register for the program as soon as you can, and make sure you are as available as possible to attend the required sessions and interviews.

If you are not able to complete the RDP within the designated timeframe, you must contact RoadSafetyBC at 1-866-387-7787 to apply for an extension to complete the program.

Step 1: Register for the RDP

You probably received a registration package when you were referred to the RDP. If you need a registration form, please contact Stroh Health Care.

To register, mail the following to Stroh Health Care:

- Completed and signed Registration and Consent form; and
- Full payment of the \$930 RDP program fee (\$905 plus \$25 GST)

Stroh's mailing address and fax number are listed on Page 2 of the registration form. There is no payment plan or financial assistance available to cover the cost, and full refunds will not be provided after registration is completed.

You can contact Stroh at 1.800.948.4912 (or 604.948.4912 in the Greater Vancouver area) if you have questions about the program. **You cannot register over the phone.**

Step 2: Actively participate in the RDP sessions

After submitting your registration form and payment, Stroh will contact you to book a screening interview.

Following the interview, Stroh will advise you in writing whether you are required to complete the 8-hour course or the 16-hour course. These courses are run in many communities across BC.

Your success in the program depends on your willingness to actively participate; it is not enough to simply show up.

Step 3: Complete the RDP course requirements

About two weeks after your last group session, Stroh will provide RoadSafetyBC with information regarding your participation in the program.

RoadSafetyBC will notify you in writing if you completed the RDP to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Motor Vehicles.

You are not considered to have completed the RDP until RoadSafetyBC has made a decision about your licensing.



I've finished the program — now what?

Be aware that your driving record will continue to be monitored after you leave the program.

The Superintendent of Motor Vehicles could prohibit you from driving or refer you to additional remedial programs.
